- Preparing and delivering lesson plans in alignment with curriculum goals with guidance from the Program Director and String Pedagogy Specialist
- Leading/assisting with evening/weekend programming, concerts, field trips, etc.
- Attending all El Sistema Colorado professional development sessions
- Assisting with other aspects of the holistic program (snack, homework, etc.)
- Preparation and communication with other El Sistema Colorado Teaching Artists, Program Director, Site Coordinator, Executive Director, and parents/families of students

- Excellent musicianship and artistry as a teacher/performer
